Your book talk will have four parts:

- 1. an intro- introduce yourself (Hello, my name is...)
- 2. information about your book (title, author, genre, total # of pages/ total audio length)
- 3. analysis of the book (CHOOSE **ONE**):
 - -What makes your book unique?
 - -What makes the main character interesting?
 - -Why is this an important books for people to read?
 - -Why is the setting important to the story?
 - -What lingering thoughts does the book leave you with?
 - -Give a 6 WORD (or 10 second) SUMMARY
 - -Describe the relationship between the protagonist and the antagonist
- 4. Give a recommendation (you should read this book because)

Expectations:
